

Greetings Church Family,

Summer is winding down, and life is settling into a more normal pace. It is always a blessing to come into church on Sunday morning and see so many familiar faces, along with some new friends. Our regular fellowship warms my heart and fills my soul. Thank you all for your presence and for your love.

On the morning of our 80th anniversary service, we began our current series, Worship with Rejoicing. Over the past six weeks, we have taken a closer look at the stories of David and Solomon, and examined how they incorporated worship into their lives. Each week we focused on a different part of our own worship liturgy: Gathering, Call to Worship, Confession, Scripture Reading, Prayers of the People, Benediction. In all we recognized the influences of our faith traditions alongside contemporary expressions and applications.

But of course the end of the service is just the beginning of our work in the world. How can we maintain that Sunday attitude of worship throughout the rest of the week? In September we will explore passages from the wisdom literature books of Song of Solomon, Proverbs, and Esther. In a society whose success strategies often appear to be exploitation, violence, and smear campaigns, these verses will show us another path to the good life. These passages might comfort or challenge us in strange ways that we haven't necessarily come to expect from biblical texts. I hope you will join us as we seek to understand these texts and challenge ourselves to let them speak truth to our realities today.



I look forward to our journey together, and pray that the love of God will surround you and keep you now and always.

Church and Society

In the month of September, we look forward to a **Harvest Potluck luncheon** on **Sunday, September 15**. It will be a pizza party! We will celebrate the harvesting of the vegetables and spices grown within our community garden and enjoy similar ones on the pizzas presented that day. We will be serving both vegetarian and vegetable and meat pizzas.

An attempt will be made to minimize our environmental impacts with this potluck. **Compostable plates** will be available to fill with pizza and salad. Even though the compostable plates once used must be thrown in the regular trash, they nevertheless break down in the landfill much more quickly than regular paper plates and are, therefore, to be preferred by we who care for the environment. The compostable plates are made of sugarcane and in their decomposition actually enhance the compost.



We will be asking folks to bring a salad, or dessert, or a six-pack or two of sodas to go with the pizzas. Remember the suggestion given last month for beverages? It is important to **choose aluminum cans or real mugs over plastic bottles or throw-away cups.** Aluminum doesn't shed microcontaminants as does plastic, and aluminum can be recycled repeatedly. Therefore, we are asking for those donating canned soda beverages to provide them in aluminum cans. Water will also be available for those who do not like soda, however, we ask that you use a reusable cup or mug or personal water bottle for the water. In so doing, we again are conscious of limiting our impact on the environment.

We remind you that a resolution passed at General Conference in 2024 urged us as United Methodists to play a role in sustainability by reducing our use of plastic, especially single-use plastic, and practicing this within our own church community by using recyclable materials and recycling. Hence, our efforts for this potluck will be to comply with that resolution.

Also in September, we will host the Aptos Circle of Village Santa Cruz, a group supporting seniors within our community, on Wednesday, September 4 at 1 PM. This is open to any senior in our church who is interested.


• For iPhone (iOS 11 or later): Launch the Camera app, frame the QR code, and tap the notification at the top of the screen.
