Greetings Church Family,

As I look out at my backyard I see remarkable change from just a few weeks ago. The dormant bare ground has yielded to a wild growth of grasses and shrubs. It's incredible to watch the area around my home transform right before my eyes.

These seasonal fluctuations are something we come to depend on. We take energy from the longer days and do some Spring cleaning. We look ahead to a Summer vacation. We eagerly anticipate family time in the Fall. Then we settle in for another Winter before the cycle repeats. It's not an exact science, but it is a sort of template we rely on as we travel through time.

But within the structure there is wide room for variation. Sometimes things don't go according to plan: a particularly violent Winter that seems to last forever, or a Summer when it seems the whole world is on fire. These natural occurrences bear resemblance to the events in our personal lives. We establish a home, set it up for success, and settle into a routine. But then something happens that disrupts the status quo.

On Sunday, March 23, we said farewell to Clyde and Sheila Vaughn. After many years of fellowship with Aptos UMC they are moving away. If you were unable to join us you may view the entire service on our <u>YouTube</u> <u>channel</u>. Their departure leaves a hole in our hearts and upsets the dynamics of our church home.

However there was one part of our sending liturgy that gave me comfort: "We feel sorrow in your leaving, yet we rejoice with you in anticipation of this new phase of your life. We will miss your love and support, yet we know you will add much to the lives of those who will be your new church family, as you have added much to our lives." Our congregation acknowledges our loss, even while we celebrate new beginnings. We say goodbye in the original sense of the word, God be with you.

And that is the true takeaway here. God is with us, in our carefully crafted plans, and in unexpected challenges and opportunities. Like the cycle of the seasons overarching the natural world, God's presence encompasses our spiritual existence. We journey through our lives to places far and wide, yet God is always there, preparing the path before us and accompanying us along the way. This is our Father's world, and as his children, all of creation is the home we share with each other.

I pray for strength and energy for Clyde and Sheila as they embark on their new adventure, and for our church as we navigate the way forward without their gifts. At the same time we remember that we remain connected as members of God's family. Our home is greater than any divide of distance or time; there is no separation for those under God's expansive roof. May the Holy Spirit continue to surround us with the presence that sustains us through all our transitions, and unites us as one body of Christ.

Church and Society

God saw everything that God had made, and indeed it was very good.

Genesis 1:10

In April, we emphasize all of God's creation. April 22 is Earth Day around the world, and this year directly follows Easter. On April 27, we will acknowledge Earth Day 2025.

At present, we as a nation are grappling with new directives from the presidential administration of our country that eliminate the standards of environmental justice toward which so many of us have been working. It means that we, as citizens and as caring people of faith, must work even harder to preserve and enhance the progress that has been made over the Earth Days of the past 53 years.

What has been happening to environmental concerns since the latest inauguration? The United States has pulled out of the Paris Agreement. The new people in charge have doubled down on oil and gas by "declaring a national emergency". They have had harsh words for the Endangered Species Act and for Arctic protections. They have revoked the goals of electric vehicles. Every directive since January has been a push **against** environmental justice.

Meanwhile, today, we understand more deeply than ever before, the profound consequences of our failure to serve as caretakers of God's creation. Ecological crises and extreme poverty are a reflection of our inability to share the abundance God has entrusted to our care. Ever-expanding scientific knowledge helps us better understand and informs our response to challenges ranging from the health impacts of environmental toxins to the threats posed by climate change, but this scientific knowledge is being disregarded and dismissed.

As stewards of this precious Earth, what can we as United Methodists do? We are called to a ministry of reconciliation between God, humankind, and creation. In and alongside frontline communities experiencing environmental injustices, many Methodists are participating in God's healing of creation. Through acts of personal, social and civic righteousness, United Methodists are modeling a new lifestyle and advocating for God's people and God's planet so that all God's children can share in the goodness of Creation.



Three Things You Can Do:

- Learn how your lifestyle and the institutions you are a part of are connected to the climate crisis. Use an
 online <u>carbon footprint calculator</u> to measure your emissions and take steps to reduce your carbon
 footprint.
- 2. Celebrate God's creation in worship and discuss the climate crisis with others in your faith community. While some may see climate change as a 'hot button' issue to be avoided, we understand it to be a moral crisis demanding an urgent response.
- 3. Advocate for policies and practices that build a clean energy future and support frontline communities struggling to survive in a changing climate.




