

Church and Society

At Easter, United Methodists across the world join with other Christians to celebrate the Risen Christ!

The journey to Easter begins on Ash Wednesday (this year on March 5) as we pause to reflect on this holy day of repentance. As we move through the 40 days of Lent, we may choose to praise and worship the Lord, to read the Bible more, and to pray more often, all in preparation for celebrating the most sacred of days, Easter. And we may choose a spiritual path for ourselves that reflects our deepest yearnings to make a difference in the world. This may be a time to learn more about the crises that other human beings in our midst are experiencing and then to engage in work to help alleviate the sufferings we observe.

Climate change, economic disparities, and social issues divide Americans, and Christians, today. But immigration seems the most urgent concern, since the present administration has made it clear that the mass deportation of undocumented immigrants is at the top of its agenda. Shortly after the inauguration, a policy was revoked that prohibited arrests by U.S. immigration agents at places of worship and other "sensitive locations." Can you imagine immigration agents coming into our Sanctuary on a Sunday morning, interrupting our service, in order to drag someone away? How would we as a community of faith react?


A top executive leader of the United Methodist Commission on Religion and Race, Rev. Giovanni Arroyo, has issued this statement: "We have to have a prophetic voice responding to the policies and the practices that will impact racial and cultural minorities in this country. The concern for our immigrant siblings is very well into the realm of xenophobia, and we are very committed to addressing xenophobia."

In a January 13 statement, the United Methodist Board of Church and Society said it "vehemently opposes the mass deportation plans put forth by the new administration. These proposals are not only antithetical to the foundational values of our democracy but also starkly contradict The United Methodist Church's Social Principles on immigration and the Wesleyan theological tradition."

The Aptos UMC Church and Society Committee invites you to learn more about these issues and to reflect upon what you can personally do to inform others and to resist any measures that you see being enacted to deny immigrants in our nearby communities from exercising their rights. We have "*Know Your Rights*" cards available in the church office which you can pick up and give to people who are being affected. English and Spanish versions are available, and 19 additional languages can be found here, or by contacting the church office. Phone calls to senators and representatives are being documented and have thus far been effective.

The Aptos group of Village Santa Cruz will be meeting at our church on Wednesday, March 5, at 1 PM. You are invited to attend if interested.




